MBGFC President's 2023/24 Annual Report

The Year That Was

After last season with its cyclones, South Easterlies and road closures it was great to have a summer that was conducive to boating and fishing.

The improved weather reflected in the number of fish caught; 230 bill fish compared to 167 the previous year. The number of Shortbill spear fish where well down 1 compared to 15 the year before as was Yellowfin Tuna at 6 compared to 55 the year before.

Although the percentage of marlin tagged was not quite as high as last year, 81 percent is still something we can be proud of, thank you to everyone who made the decision to tag and release their fish, this supports the moratorium that stops marlin being on the commercial catch list.

The leader board has been hotly contested again congratulations to the winners.

Champion angler: Kelly Chambers

Champion Boat: Rustler

Some notable catches this season:

- Junior angler James Davies a 98.2 kg Pacific Bluefin Tuna junior and NZ record,
- Junior angler Jack Rogers 207.1kg Blue Marlin caught during the Kubota,
- Jason Sheriff's 12 Tagged and released Bill fish, congratulations to these anglers.

And Congratulations to Kelly Chambers who has been Awarded the New Zealand Sports Fishing Council, Old Man of the Sea Cup for Most Meritorious Catch and the 23-24 Angler of the Year. For her 300kg Broadbill (a world record claim) caught on 24kg of the year, and her 103kg striped marlin on 10kg line, several tag and released billfish and southern bluefin tuna to round of the season.

I would like to congratulate Club cup winners, pin certificate recipients and new club records holders.

New Zealand Sport Fishing Council Club of The Year

MBGFC has been awarded the NZSFC 23/24 Club of the year. This is a prestigious award, and I want to recognise the contribution our members, volunteers, committee, staff, past and present that have created the award-winning club we can all be proud of.

Tournament Wrap Up

All tournaments went ahead as scheduled except the no bait that had to be rescheduled due to the weather. All the Tournaments were well organised with good participation, a credit to the tournament convenors.

We saw the Junior Tournament take on a new format with a big gate prize. This proved very successful with entries increasing from 71 angler in 2023 to 132 anglers in 2024.

The Kubota Billfish Classic was another highlight of the year with boat entrants increased from 265 in 2023 to 420 boats in 2024. The change to the larger venue at the Northern reclamation by the Marina both accommodated the larger crowd and allowed a better public interaction.

The Commercial Health of The Club

- While the business environment has remained challenging the club has shown a strong end of financial year net profit of \$103,346.00
- There has been a slight increase in our membership from 3131 to 3366.
- Our social media presence remains strong particularly during tournaments, with 20,020 followers on Facebook and 3900 on Instagram and our Facebook reach was 1.2 million and Instagram 122000.
- The outdated data base and tournament computer program I mentioned last year is almost resolved with the new system in the trial phase. We are looking forward to having this up and running for the coming seasons tournaments, allowing online entries, payments, alterations and confirmation.
- As an Incorporated society we have to reregister by April 2026 to meet the new Incorporated Societies Act, We along with enthusiastic volunteers Damian and Colleen Jaques are working through our constitution, line by line to meet that new standard, As our constitution has evolved over a long period of time the balance is to keep what we have now but bring it up to the new standard. One aspect of the new Act is that the responsibilities of committee members will be similar to that of a Company Director so good processes and governance will be even more important going forward. The process will be to get the new constitution to a draft stage, distribute it to the membership, seek feedback, and then have a series of workshops. With the aim to get a consensus and sign off at the 2025 AGM or possibly an EGM before that.

Regulatory

The proposed Hauraki Gulf Marine Park Protection Bill will have a major impact on where we can fish. The Bill proposes to extent the Cathedral cove reserve and make 2 High Protection areas (reserves) out from the Alderman Islands; the northern protection area at 138 square kilometres and southern protection area 150 square kilometres. We made submissions opposing the creation of these reserves first in writing followed by an oral submission before the Parliamentary Environment select committee. Our submission was supported by other clubs and NZSFC.

We submitted that these reserves would have a significant financial impact to the region, that game fishing had no impact on the seabed these reserves propose to protect, and the gulf has far bigger issues, such as overfishing, destructive fishing methods and run off, in other words Oasis in a desert is not a solution.

Although it still has to work through the Parliamentary system, all that effort was probably in vain as the Select committee's decision is to leave the areas and designation of these reserves unchanged. Maybe if you have an opportunity, bring this up with your local Member of Parliament.

Club Governance

As with any club there is a huge number of people that contribute to the success of a club. We have been fortunate again this year to have a committee that understands fishing and wants to promote sport fishing but also understands their governance role.

Special thanks to our VP Anne Smal her contribution to the club has been immense again this year. In particular, for the work she has put into the development of the new club fishing management software and continued progression of our financial management systems. Her attention to detail is setting the club up for the future.

We held 11 tournaments this year. A huge shout out to the people who put their hand up to be tournament conveners, without them tournaments just don't happen. Tournaments are a huge part of our club's identity, and this role is not always an easy one,

We have added two new tournaments for the 24-25 season; the revival of the Trailer Boat Tournament by popular demand, and a one-off Centennial tournament celebrating one hundred years since the first Marlin was weighed by the club on 26th February 1925.

The Kubota Has Moved On

You could argue that the Kubota Tournament has become a victim of its own success and has grown to the point that it is too time consuming for a single volunteer to commit too.

Additionally, under The Gambling Act (Prize Competition) Game Rules 2004, fishing competitions that charge an entry fee and award prizes for the biggest fish caught are considered gambling. As an incorporated society, MBGFC is not permitted to directly compensate someone for organising the tournament. However, the club acknowledges the need for adequate reimbursement for the substantial workload required to stage this Tournament.

Following extensive internal discussions and consultation with Thomas Maxwell, the decision has been made for Tom to continue organising the Kubota independently. Tom's organisation will contract the necessary services from MBGFC, including weighmasters, recorders, and other essential roles back to the club.

Tom remains a dedicated member of our club, and we wish him every success in his future endeavours. MBGFC will provide any needed support to ensure the continued success of the tournament.

Our Club Is Our Volunteers

There is no question that the heartbeat of our club is our volunteers.

We have 16 trained weigh masters who give their time freely often when they would rather be fishing themselves, thank you for your time, dedication and integrity.

Also thank you to all the volunteers whether it be helping put up tents, sell raffle tickets or driving the courtesy van, you make the running of the club so much easier and contributed to the success of the club.

Also, a big shout to the sponsors your contribution is huge and keeps the club viable and able to focus on our membership.

Thanks John Neighbours our past President for continuing in his role of editor and publisher of what I am told is his last yearbook.

I commented last year on our awesome staff and that is still the case I would also like to recognise the professionalism of our staff we are truly fortunate with the calibre of staff we have.

We have had a few staff changes this year
